HONORING ALL THOSE WHO SERVED



BRRRR....It's Getting Cold Outside

As the weather gets colder coats, hats & gloves or mittens are necessary for outdoor recess.

Younger children are less likely to realize they are getting cold as their smaller bodies lose heat rapidly. So it's important to make sure they are dressed appropriately for the colder weather. Here's some tips to follow as the days get colder.

- 1) Layer Up! - A good rule of thumb - your child should wear one more layer than you would for the same weather conditions.
- 2) Cover Those Fingers, Faces & Toes! - A child's head, face ears, hands and feet are most prone to cold exposure and frostbite. Keep them covered and protected from the cold.
- 3) Keep Them Dry! - We all know how much colder you are once you also get wet. Adding boots and snow pants once the snow begins to pile up will help keep them warm & dry. It's also a good idea to send a spare change of clothes to keep at school just in case they do get wet.
