

PSBA Years of Service Award: Dan Martin; 12 years 1923 JSHS Salvaged Gymnasium Floor



The first two photos are of the gymnasium floor from the time period 1923 to 1974. The photos show the demolition as it was taking place during the 2007 renovation project. This area has been repurposed as the first floor Business wing (horseshoe area) at the JSHS. During the 2007 renovation the original floor was discovered underneath the protective underlayment board in the area that was re-purposed to the library from the 1974 renovation.





Upon uncovering the original gymnasium floor, we stopped the demolition crew and salvaged the center court tee from being lost forever (picture #3).

The last photo shows the salvaged 1923 gymnasium floor which is proudly on display located at our Auditorium Lobby.

The Troy Environmental and Sustainability Club has taken over the Trex Recycling Challenge. Over the last 5 weeks, a few members from the club have collected recycling from local businesses. President Owen Williams, Vice President Hunter Kulago, and Senior Jacob Case have spearheaded the project and collected 405+ pounds of plastic so far. The club has also begun collecting plastic from the community as well on the 2nd Saturday of every month at Alparon park, Gate 2, from 8-9 AM; they will be collecting Trex plastics and all other hard plastics. All of these will be recycled by the club. The club is optimistic for the future and hopes to collect 500+ pounds every month and we want to ask every community member to help us reach our goal. Covid-19 has dramatically affected the club and halted our ability to compost in school, but we hope we will be able to change that for early 2021 or for the following school year.


Gingerbread House Competition



<u>DroneBlocks App & Curriculum - Learn to Code with Drones!</u>



The Troy Area School District STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Math) department received notice of a Repsol Oil & Gas USA, LLC Donation Grant award in the amount of \$3,500.00. This grant is a first

for the newly minted TASD STEM department. This grant will fund a classroom set of (10) Drones to be purchased from DroneBlocksEDU (https://www.droneblocks.io). With this kit students at TASD will have the opportunity to create, engineer, and code friendly indoor Tello drones using a mixture of Block, Python and JavaScript code. In addition to the hardware, the kit includes is a drone simulator, and an all-inclusive curriculum (100+ Lessons on Block, Python, and JavaScript Coding) for students and teachers grades 4 to 12. This equipment, as well as a new partnership with Repsol representatives, will provide students with a real-world, hands-on opportunity to explore drone technology in the field of STEM and is the first step of many to developing a comprehensive K-12 STEM program at TASD. This cutting-edge program offers students the opportunity to explore college and career pathways in the field of STEM.
